- The agenda for this meeting was accepted with no changes
- The minutes from the last QBC meeting were approved
- There were no changes from the previous treasurer's report

New Business –

- Summer Camp is June 1st through June 11th
 - We would like to get parents to donate drinks or get businesses to donate drinks (something like Gatorade – 50 drinks/night). Last year the total bill was \$500.
 - We talked about having QBC buy T-shirts for the kids. They would run \$7-\$8 each, for a total cost of around \$500
 - It would be nice to have watermelon for the kids on the night before the scrimmage
 - An open question is whether or not there will be a bus to Prairie View for the scrimmage
 - There isn't a fee planned for the camp, but there will no trainer or insurance unless there are funds to pay for both (We could charge \$25 per kid)
 - We probably need some lunches packed for the scrimmage
- Lafayette wants to raise the cost of putting up the home game banner on Public road to \$200/season (It started out at \$50 two years ago and went up to \$100 last year)
- Jim talked about getting more participation from the cheerleaders for things like the fund raisers and pasta feeds
- Jim showed a copy of this year's game schedule card.
- The Freshman Sports Fair is on May 9th
- We talked about an end-of-season video that would be available for purchase by the kids. The concern is the cost of getting a video made can be very expensive. There are several options that people are going to check on.
- Scott Shald is looking into ways to get the team involved in the community
 - There is no official "spring cleaning day" in Lafayette
 - The rec center is always looking for volunteer s for their fun run and triathlon
 - There's Open Space Day where volunteers are needed for cleaning up trails, etc.
 - The city is also looking for volunteers for the Oatmeal Festival in January
- Jerry Howard talked a bit about The Yard training facility and he is running a high school all-state football combine at Holy Family on May 2nd
